European Internet Network provides information on countries including Hungary, Poland, and the Czech Republic. Current issues and cultural information are included.

This site features historical data on World War I, World War II and Adolph Hitler. An extension of the TV channel, the site also promotes products associated with its programming.

An outstanding site that features a Timeline of World War II and a unit on Nazi Germany and World War II. Photo journals and noted speeches are also included.
