TV MOVES TO HEAD OF CLASS!

Senate Bill 55 was passed by the Ohio General Assembly in August 1997. The emphasis of SB55 was school improvement and academic accountability. Highlighted in SB55 were minimum standards for performance, high school exit exams and graduation requirements, fourth-grade guarantee, academic remediation, and retention for habitually truant students. It also seeks safer and more productive school environments.

Parents of TV students should have received a mailing recently from the State Department of Education, identifying how our school district performed according to those standards. Anyone else interested in seeing these results or anyone with questions about the Report Card may contact my office.

Tusky Valley has established a Continuous Improvement Plan to set a direction that will allow all of us to focus on accountability. This plan in no way is a quick fix; many of the goals were established for two to three years from now. The main focus of the Continuous Improvement Plan is to use the state performance data as the basis for developing actions of the district. This plan will meet requirements of the law/SB55 and the fiscal accountability of HB412.

The 2001 Local Report Card reflects student progress for school year 1999-2000, along with comparisons from past years. On January 30, *The Times Reporter* headline read "TV Moves to Head of the Class." Tuscarawas Valley led all schools in the county, meeting 23 of the 27 established state standards. We are currently ranked as a "Continuous Improvement" school. Our goal is to attain the rank of an "Effective School" by meeting all 27 standards.


